A new Romeo & Juliet for Les Grands Ballets

Montreal, March 1, 2022 - The tragedy of the lovers of Verona has endured through the centuries and comes back to the stage of Les Grands Ballets in a new version, signed by Ivan Cavallari. On the famous notes of Prokofiev, the purity of Romeo and Juliet's love comes to life from March 23 to 27 at Salle Wilfrid-Pelletier. A breathtaking show that will let the company's 47 dancers shine and showcase its Orchestra.

Inspired by Prokofiev's timeless score, Ivan Cavallari centers his neoclassical retelling of this love story on the characters Romeo and Juliet, whose names have been heard through time. Drawing on Italian literature from the 14th, 15th and 16th centuries, Cavallari decorates the Shakespearian story and gives himself a few liberties with this mythical story. The resulting setting is equally uncluttered and full of references to ignite the spectators' imagination, transporting them to a place beyond time where our eternal lovers' plight plays out across the eras.

"Romeo and Juliet is a universal love story that has inspired many generations of artists from Dante to Shakespeare, who brought to this story a worldwide popularity. I like to think that Romeo and Juliet shouldn't be connected to a specific period as I believe love inhabits an ageless space." - Ivan Cavallari, Artistic Director and Choreographer

Cavallari preserves the tragic and humorous dimensions of Shakespeare's play while reappropriating the dramaturgy in his own way: he introduces a new character, Countess Guelfi, and develops the storylines of the parents with rich intrigue and dangerous liaisons. All the ingredients of a tragedy are present: innocence, passion, games of power. His work is a portrait of the disorder of the world and the fragility of existence, mirroring Shakespearean themes of death and the quest for redemption.

Les Grands Ballets has always believed in the importance of reaching out to sick, vulnerable and disadvantaged children by giving them access to creativity and the arts. We are pleased to propose a new project that was created for young people and takes our new pandemic reality into account.

In March 2022, **3 educational matinée performances** based on the ballet Romeo and Juliet will be presented for children from underprivileged schools and children's foundations, on March 18 and 19, 2022 at Les Grands Ballets' Studio-Théâtre (Édifice Wilder) and on March 25, 2022 at Salle Wilfrid-Pelletier.

These exclusive performances will charm and delight close to **2,500 young people** and accompanying adults, in collaboration with *Une école montréalaise pour tous*, a program of the Québec Ministry of Education, and the **Politique de l'enfant de la Ville de Montréal**, as part of its *Diversity and Social Inclusion Fund*. Fundraising campaign for Romeo & Juliet's costumes

Les Grands Ballets launched last fall a campaign for the costume of this new ballet. The public is invited to take part in this creation by contributing directly to financing the roughly 140 costumes for this classic, tailored to measure for more than 40 dancers.

Romeo & Juliet's costumes means...

- A total of approximately 140 costumes
- A deployment of a kilometer's worth of fabric! (1,000 meters of fabric purchased)
- More than \$570,000 invested in the costumes, including \$12,000 and \$10,000 respectively for Juliet's and Romeo's wardrobes
- Working time estimated at close to 8,000 hours (including research and development, cutting and sewing)

All of Les Grands Ballets' costumes have been designed in the company's workshop, for over 60 years! They're used for many performances, and regularly have to be adjusted to the heights of new dancers. Their lifespan is about 10 years.
