## LES GRANDS BALLETS WELCOMES SEVEN NEW DANCERS INCLUDING TWO PRINCIPAL DANCERS

**Montreal, September 30, 2019** – There are fresh faces at Les Grands Ballets! The company is proud to be welcoming seven new dancers for the 2019-2020 season, two of them principal dancers: Rachele Buriassi and Roddy Doble. Graeme Fuhrman and Étienne Gagnon-Delorme, meanwhile, are joining the corps de ballet, while the company welcomes Jordan Faye, Tatiana Lerebours and Catherine Toupin as apprentices.

#### RACHELE BURIASSI AND RODDY DOBLE, Principal dancers

A native of Sarzana, Italy, **Rachele Buriassi** entered the John Cranko School at the age of 14. After taking her diploma, she became part of the corps de ballet of the renowned Stuttgart Ballet, where she was promoted to first soloist in 2012. She joined the Boston Ballet in 2015, also as first soloist.

A native of Connecticut, **Roddy Dobble** joined the corps de ballet of the American Ballet Theatre in 2008, and then the Boston Ballet in 2013. He was promoted to soloist there in 2017.

# **GRAEME FUHRMAN AND ÉTIENNE GAGNON-DELORME**, Corps de ballet

Born in Stratford, Ontario, **Graeme Fuhrman** did his classical training at Canada's National Ballet School. After graduating, he danced with the Bundesjugendballett (2011-2013) and the Hamburg Ballet (2013-2019).

Ottawa native **Étienne Gagnon-Delorme** danced for Les Grands Ballets as a supernumerary during his studies at the École supérieure de Ballet du Québec. After his training he joined the company of the Mainfranken Theater Würzburg in Germany.

#### JORDAN FAYE, TATIANA LEREBOURS AND CATHERINE TOUPIN, Apprentices

**Jordan Faye** was born in Tananarive, the capital of Madagascar. In 2006 he settled in Montreal and was admitted to the École Supérieure de Ballet du Québec. In the course of his studies there he worked with a number of choreographers, including Roberto Campanella, Andrew Skeels and Gioconda Barbuto.

Montrealer **Tatiana Lerebours** participated in Les Grands Ballets' *Nutcracker* starting in 2011. In 2019 she danced with the company in *Giselle*, taking the role of a Wili. She is joining Les Grands Ballets as an apprentice a year before the conclusion of her training at the École supérieure de ballet du Québec.

After her early years in Laval, **Catherine Toupin** began her training in dance at the École supérieure de Ballet du Québec at the age of 10. She took part on three occasions in the Fondation de la Place des Arts' *Future Stars' Grand Premiere*, and appeared in *The Nutcracker*, *Vendetta* and *Giselle* during the 2018-2019 season of Les Grands Ballets as a supernumerary.

#### **APPOINTMENT**

The company hails the appointment of **Maude Sabourin** to the position of soloist. A native of Terrebonne, Maude joined Les Grands Ballets last season after spending 10 years with Les Ballets de Monte-Carlo.
